
Gangā Avataraņa Māhātmyam Message 1: Making Life choices

60,000 + 1 children for Sagara

- Life constantly throws choices in front of us which are good or pleasant
 - Good is far in between & few in number
 - Good is generally not appealing at the outset, even counterintuitive
 - Good is a less treaded path
- Individuals need to make these choices, the LORD does not hand down these choices to us
 - However we can pray to the Lord for endowing us with a sense of discrimination

Five generational effort for redemption




- Ancestors blessings are very valuable

Gangā Avataraṇa Māhātmyam Message 3: Indications of great effort


Multiple references to large numbers

- Big numbers in the story
 - 60,001 children
 - 125,000 years of effort
 - 5 generations of coordinated effort
- These numbers are meant to emphasize the large effort required



Gangā Avataraṇa Māhātmyam Message 4: Great efforts & Great impact

- Enormous efforts
 - 125,000 years of penance spread over5 generations
 - 60,000 perish for a cause
 - Coordinated efforts by many –
 Brahma, Śiva, Gangā, Devas, Indra,
 Elephants, Vinata, Kapila, Jahnu ...
- Impact has to be of equal magnitude if not more
- Greater good for the society in a sustained manner requires such efforts




Gangā Avataraņa Māhātmyam Message 5: Events in the episode?

Gangā Avataraṇa Māhātmyam Message 6: Gangā Mātā is holy to us...

- The efforts and the results places this whole issue in a different pedestal
 - Gangā ≠ Ganges (River)
 - She is nothing but direct manifestation of Divinity
 - She has descended for a great cause
- Expression of the infinite compassion of Divine mother, Prakṛtī
- Reminds us of the five messages that we already saw
- Is a source of not only perennial water but also perennial inspiration

Gangā Avataraṇa Māhātmyam Devas watch the phenomenon in awe

ततो देवर्षिगन्धर्वा यक्षसिद्धगणास्तदा ॥ 1.43.17 व्यलोकयन्त ते तत्र गगनाद्गां गतां तथा।

Then devarsis, gandharvas, yakṣas and hosts of siddhas looked on with astonishment at Gangā falling from the sky and descending on the earth. विमानेर्नगराकारेर्हयेर्गजवरेस्तदा।। 1.43.18 पारिप्लवगतेश्चापि देवतास्तत्र विष्ठिता:।

Then, gods in a state of excitement in their aerial chariots as large as cities, on horses and on big elephants were stationed there (in the sky).

Gangā Avataraṇa Māhātmyam Devas watch the phenomenon in awe

तदद्भवां लोके गङ्गापतनमुत्तमम्।। 1.43.19 दिदृक्षवां देवगणाः समीयुरिमतौजसः।

Gods with great lustre arrived to witness the most wonderful, grand descent of Gangā.

सम्पतिद्धस्सुरगणैस्तेषां चाभरणौजसा।। 1.43.20 शतादित्यिमवाभाति गगनं गततोयदम्।

The cloudless sky shone with the radiance of the ornaments of the gods alighting speedily to witness Gangā. It appeared as though the sky was filled with a hundred Suns.

Gangā Avataraņa Māhātmyam Gangā finally reaches the earth

तच्छङ्करशिरोभ्रष्टं भ्रष्टं भूमितले पुनः।।1.43.25 व्यरोचत तदा तोयं निर्मलं गतकल्मषम्।

The waters of Gangā descended on Śankara's head and from there to the earth. Freed from all impurities, the waters looked pure and clean.

धन्यं यशस्यमायुष्यं पुत्र्यं स्वर्ग्यमतीव च। यश्श्रावयति विप्रेषु क्षत्रियेष्वितरेषु च॥ 1.44.21 प्रीयन्ते पितरस्तस्य प्रीयन्ते दैवतानि च।

He will be blessed with fame, longevity, progeny and (after death) heaven brahmins One who recites this story of Gangā to the Kṣatriyas and others, the gods and his forefathers would be pleased with him.
